Debbi Lindenberg has extensive experience in philanthropy and law. In 2023, she joined Capital for Children as Executive Director, where she is overseeing operations and grantmaking and continuing her commitment to building collaborative relationships with nonprofits. Capital for Children is a membership organization of leaders in private equity and related industries that invests in nonprofits serving children, youth, and young adults in the DC region.

Prior to Capital for Children, Debbi was a Program Officer at The Morris and Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation for 13 years, where she oversaw an annual portfolio of \$2.4 million distributed to approximately 65 nonprofit grantees in the areas of Civil Legal Aid, Violence Prevention and Victim Services, Criminal Justice and Capacity Building. She has also worked as a grantmaker for the Community Foundation for Montgomery County, an affiliate of the Greater Washington Community Foundation.

Debbi practiced law for 15 years in both the private and non-profit sectors, including a Women's Law and Public Policy Fellowship at the Georgetown University Law Center Domestic Violence Clinic. Her board service includes the DC Advisory Council of Avodah, a national organization engaging the Jewish community in social justice and the fight against poverty. She is a seasoned and enthusiastic supporter of collective giving, having served in a leadership role for many years on the Rainmakers Giving Circle of the Washington Area Women's Foundation. She also founded a giving circle for teenagers and their parents to promote intergenerational discussions about needs in the community and the role of family philanthropy.

Debbi is a 2017 graduate of the Leadership Montgomery CORE Program. She received her JD from the University of Pennsylvania Law School and her BA from Duke University.
